SUTURES: Unless you are told otherwise, all sutures are absorbable under removed. Do not clean or apply ointment to incision site. If you are told that you return in 10-14 days to have them removed. DO NOT ALLOW YOUR PET TO INCISION. If your pet is licking at the incision site, purchase an Elizabethan col veterinarian to be worn until the site is completely healed.
